

Bushcare Report for November 2020

In November the Friends of Belair National Park worked a total of 139 hours. This was despite of one session lost to hot weather, one lost to the COVID-19 lockdown, and one lost to a Total Fire Ban in the Mt. Lofty Ranges. We spent 67 hours in VMU 37, and 72 hours in VMU 38. We removed South African daisy, boneseed and broom, some Sollya and Blackberry, and a lot of Monadenia and Watsonia, especially in VMU 37.

There is still some work to be done in VMU 38. We have only checked a 30 metre strip of mostly good bush land along Warri Parri Track, parallel to Upper Sturt Road, as per our Bushcare plan.

A reminder that our Bushcare sessions will have a break over the Christmas period, from December 21st until the 11th of January.

We are very grateful to Mick Ayre, who has agreed to take on the Bushcare Coordinator role in 2021.
